#### **GRANT SUCCESS IN THE LOWER MN RIVER — WEST WATERSHED**



The Lower Minnesota River – West Watershed is celebrating a major milestone in its ongoing efforts to improve water quality. Thanks to the first in a series of grants, local conservationists and landowners are making significant strides toward healthier soil, cleaner water, and a more resilient landscape. Through strong partnerships and a shared vision for conservation, the watershed secured \$821,617 in state funding along with \$149,174.51 in Federal/landowner matches. This grant, funded by the Clean Water Land and Legacy Amendment money, focused on high-impact conservation practices across the watershed such as; water and sediment control basins (WASCOBs), grade stabilization structures, cover crops and no-till/strip-till. These practices are designed to impact both water quality and quantity flowing to major tributaries such as High Island Creek, Rush River and the Minnesota River. The grant's success is rooted in strong regional collaboration. The Lower MN River – West Partnership spreads across parts of Mcleod, Nicollet, Renville, and Sibley counties. LGU staff and local stakeholders

have used a science-based, targeted approach to identify and prioritize projects that provide the best bang for the buck. The One Watershed, One Plan (1W1P) framework has helped align funding with the watershed's top resource concerns.

"Having this grant allowed us to work directly with landowners and get a lot of quality projects on the ground," said Joel Wurscher, District Manager of Sibley SWCD. "Support from state and federal programs is critical, but it's the commitment from the landowners in the watershed that really drove the success of the grant." With momentum building, the watershed is well-positioned to continue improving water quality through a second state grant. ## MINNESOTA RIVER — MANKATO ONE WATERSHED, ONE PLAN

The Minnesota River – Mankato Watershed One Watershed, One Plan (1W1P) is well underway. This watershed has representatives from Blue Earth County, Blue Earth Soil and Water Conservation District, Le Sueur County, Le Sueur Soil and Water Conservation District, Nicollet County, Nicollet Soil and Water Conservation District and the cities of: Lake Crystal, Mankato, North Mankato, and St Peter. The watershed just wrapped up the internal review period and is preparing for public review this winter. After public review and approval by the policy committee, the Comprehensive Water-



shed Management Plan (CWMP) will be submitted to the Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR) for approval. Once approved, there will be funding available for both structural and nonstructural projects within the watershed. Preference will be given to projects within higher priority areas to ensure progress is made to best address the issues within our watershed.


