LOWER MN RIVER WEST WATERSHED SEES SUCCESS

Thanks to Watershed Based Implementation Funding (WBIF), the Lower Minnesota River West Watershed (LMRW) has seen tremendous success. Numerous conservation practices were implemented throughout the watershed to help improve soil health and water quality. The Lower Minnesota River West Watershed covers parts of Nicollet, McLeod, Sibley, and Renville counties. The watershed implemented 23 projects, 5 of which were located in Nicollet County. These practices consisted of water and sediment control basins, cover crops, and no-till/ strip-till. In the two-year grant period, the watershed has contracted towards 4,707.56 acres of cover crops, 1,809.2 acres of no-till/strip-till, 2 grade stabilization structures, 11 water and sediment control basins (WASCOBs), and 1 terrace.



WBIF funding covers many practices, including structural practices and incentives for nonstructural practices. Structural practices will be cost-shared at an unprecedented 90% and incentives for non-structural practices vary depending on the chosen practice. The implementation of these projects is successful because of the cooperation with landowners who support and promote the sustainability of the land and waters we all rely on. Minnesota River — Mankato One Watershed, One Plan





The Minnesota River – Mankato Watershed One Watershed, One Plan (1W1P) planning process has begun. This watershed has representatives from Blue Earth County, Blue Earth Soil and Water Conservation District, Le Sueur County, Le Sueur Soil and Water Conservation District, Nicollet County, Nicollet Soil and Water Conservation District and the cities of: Lake Crystal, Mankato, North Mankato, and St Peter. This summer, the 1W1P representatives hosted 2 public kickoff meetings to include the community within the planning process, educate community members on the purpose of a watershed plan and provide opportunities to offer feedback about what issues and resources are most important to them. After reviewing data from the

public kickoff meeting, agency reports, and feedback from local experts, we identified some priority issues that we will focus on addressing throughout the planning and implementation process.
